Pursuant to Governor Baker's March 12, 2020 Order Suspending Certain Provisions of the Open Meeting Law, G.L. c. 30A, §18, and the Governor's March 15, 2020 Order imposing strict limitation on the number of people that may gather in one place, this meeting of the Webster Board of Selectmen will be conducted via remote participation to the greatest extent possible. Specific information and the general guidelines for remote participation by members of the public and/or parties with a right and/or requirement to attend this meeting can be found on the Town's website, at www.webster-ma.gov. Limited in-person attendance of members of the public will be permitted, but every effort will be made to ensure that the public can adequately access the proceedings in real time, via technological means. For this meeting, members of the public who wish to watch the meeting may do so via Vonage. To join, residents should login into Vonage at this site: <https://meetings.vonage.com/742603372>. Residents can call this number to join via telephone by calling (732) 200-1872. Those who wish to participate in or watch the meeting remotely, via Vonage, must pre-register by 4:00 pm on Monday, July 31, 2023, by emailing selectmen@webster-ma.gov and request access to the meeting. On July 16, 2022, Governor Healy signed into law An Act Relative to Extending Certain State of Emergency Accommodations, which, among other things, extends the expiration of the provisions pertaining to the Open Meeting Law to March 31, 2025. Specifically, this extension allows public bodies to continue holding meetings remotely without a quorum of the public body physically present at a meeting location, and to provide "adequate, alternative" access to remote meetings. The Act does not make any new changes to the Open Meeting Law other than extending the expiration date of the temporary provisions regarding remote meetings from July 15, 2022, to March 31, 2025.
